



In Matt and Mara, the fourth feature from Canadian filmmaker Kazik Radwanski, a university Director: Kazik Radwanski professor's marriage suffers as a man from her past re-enters her orbit. Coming off its premiere at Berlinale, the film marks a bold leap forward for Radwanski, whose work has already made him a pillar of Toronto independent cinema. With a taut yet improvisational style reminiscent Napoleone of John Cassavetes, Matt and Mara is a stunning showcase of co-leads Deragh Campbell (Anne at 13,000 ft) and Matt Johnson (Blackberry), capturing two of Canada's greatest talents at the height of their powers.




