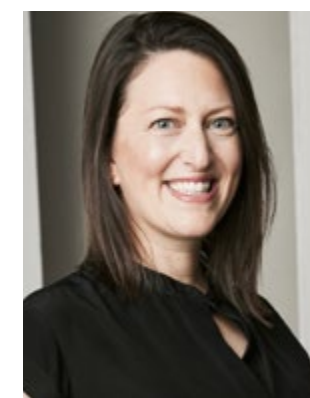

When more vehicles go off-road rounding the sharp turn outside their home, the couple's relationship becomes strained as Josh develops an obsession with rescuing the victims. The highly anticipated feature from Atlantic writer-director Jason Buxton (*Blackbird*), based on a short story by Russell Wangersky, *Sharp Corner* is an unforgettable domestic thriller that dives deep into the conflicting psychologies that drive a family. From trailblazing American director Sean Baker (*Tangerine*, *The Florida Project*) comes *Anora*, the electrifying Coney Island drama that took home the Palme d'Or at this year's Cannes Film Festival. It follows Ani (Mikey Madison, *Once Upon a Time in Hollywood*), a Russian-American sex worker in Brooklyn who stumbles into her own Cinderella story. When she impulsively marries the son of a Russian oligarch, his parents head for America to try to get it annulled. Despite its fairy-tale premise, *Anora* is a film true to its creator's humanist mission. Baker continues to point his camera toward the underseen corners of America's working class, and *Anora* may be his strongest document yet of the joys and struggles of modern life.

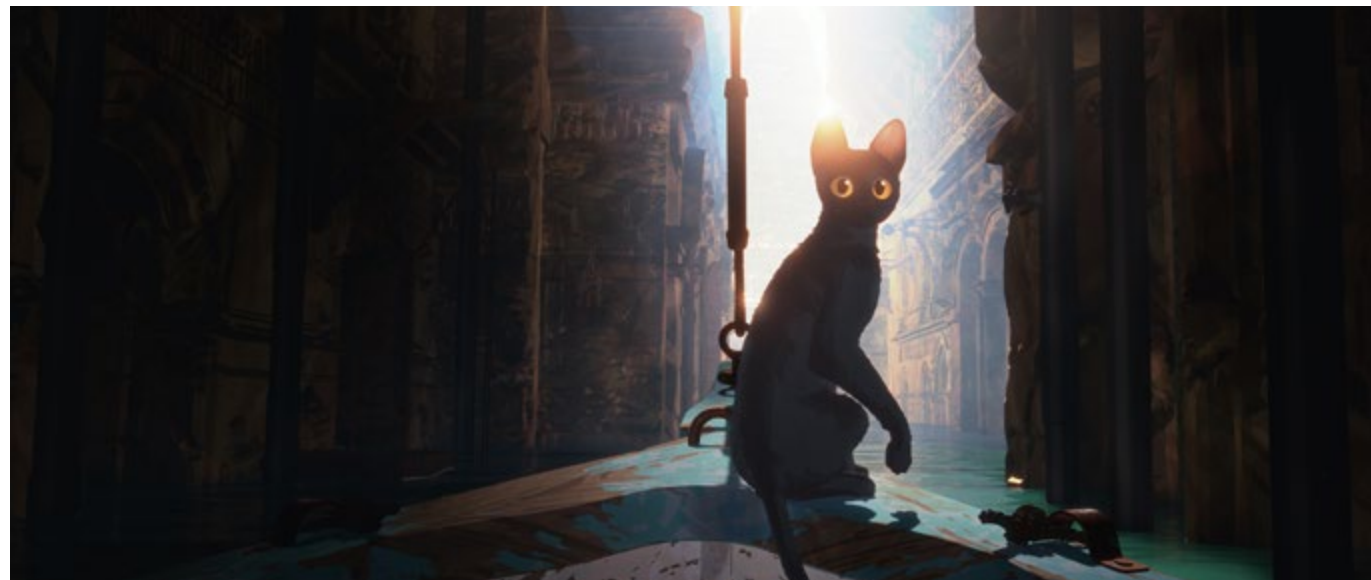

Coming off its premiere at Berlinale, the film marks a bold leap forward for Radwanski, whose work has already made him a pillar of Toronto independent cinema. With a taut yet improvisational style reminiscent of John Cassavetes, *Matt and Mara* is a stunning showcase of co-leads Deragh Campbell (*Anne at 13,000 ft*) and Matt Johnson (*Blackberry*), capturing two of Canada's greatest talents at the height of their powers.
